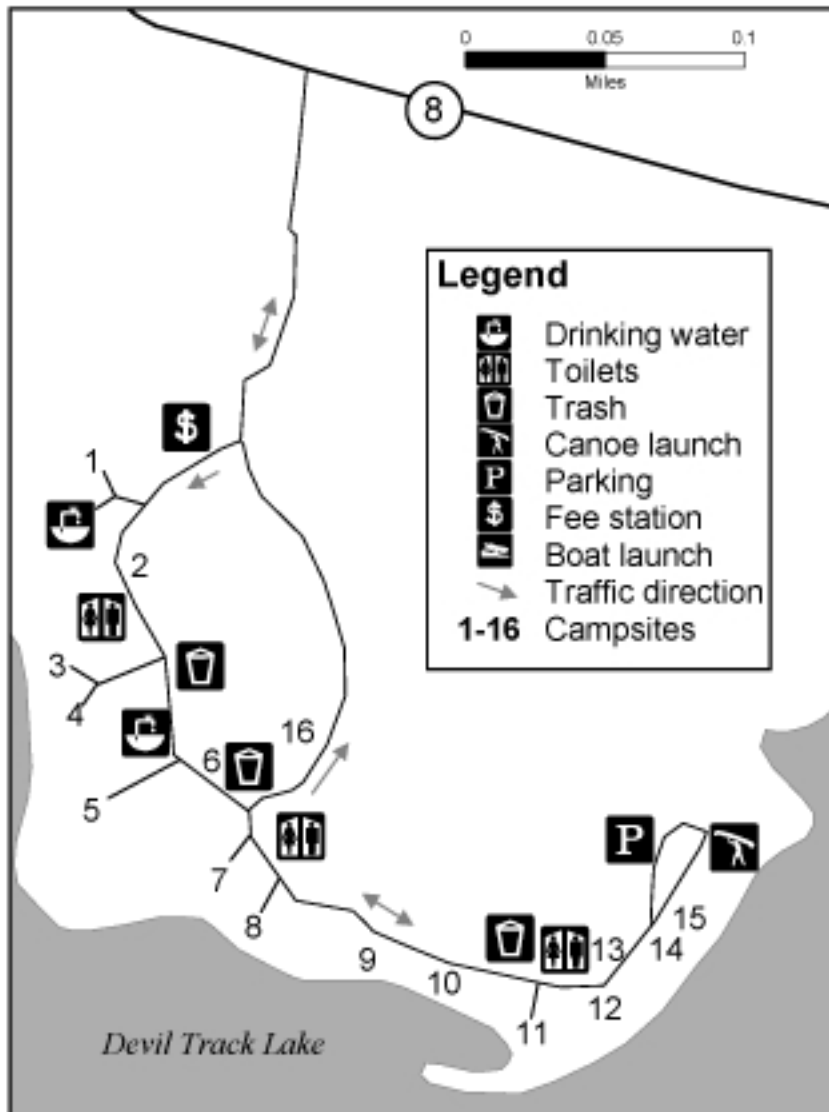


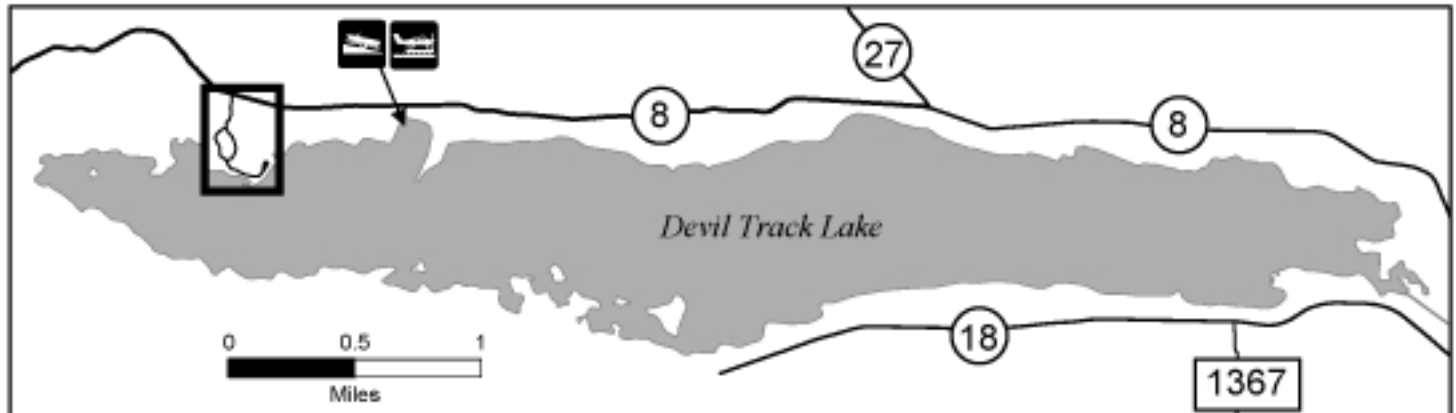
# Superior National Forest - Devil Track Lake



## Description

The name of this lake and river comes from the Ojibwe. "Devil Track River," wrote Gilfillan, "is *Manido bimadagakowini zibi*, meaning the 'spirits (or God) walking-place-on-the-ice river.'" (MN Historical Society) The name suggests something supernatural about the lake, river and its ice, but lacks the negative meaning of the English translation 'devil'.

This is the closest campground to Grand Marais, and has access for all kinds of water activities. There is a carry down boat launch in the campground and larger vessels can be launched at the Forest Service/ MnDNR Seaplane Dock one-half mile east of the campground. You may also want to explore nearby streams for great trout fishing.
